Meet TCB's New Security Officer, Dennis Dvorjak



Retired FBI Special Agent, Dennis Dvorjak, brings extensive security and investigative experience to TCB as our new Security Officer. A native of Pittsburg, PA, Dvorjak earned his undergraduate degree from Robert Morris University in 1979 and a masters degree from Carnegie Mellon University in 1990. He entered the FBI as a Special Agent, FBI on May 3, 1992, where he was assigned to the Louisville Division.

During his time in the FBI, Dvorjak aggressively conducted a wide variety of lengthy, difficult and complex criminal investigations including bank robbery, wire fraud, comercial loan fraud, counterfeit cases, embezzlement, mortgage fraud, insider threat, and public corruption. He was also a Senior SWAT Team Leader, conducted security training to financial institutions regarding various fraud schemes and assisted in the development of robbery action plans. Dvorjak's significant national investigations include the Oklahoma City Bombing and the Terror Attacks of 9/11.

In 1992, Dvorjak was promoted as the FBI Relief Supervisor for the Western Kentucky Resident Agencies with offices in Paducah, Owensboro, Hopkinsville, Bowling Green, and Elizabethtown/Ft. Knox. While in Kentucky, he was responsible for the Operations Plans for Kentucky Derby and Oaks at Chruchill Downs, the Kentucky Derby Festival, 2010 Equestrian Games at Kentucky Horse Park, and the 2008 Ryder Cup at Valhalla Golf Course. He retired from the FBI in April 2014.

Dvorjak has been married to Mary Rose for 32 years and has six children.

Several easy tips from Dennis to help keep your home safe and secure:

- Trim shrubs and bushes to limit hiding places.
- Use adequate lighting around the residence.
- Locks and deadbolts on all doors, if possible.
- Have a dog. A big, mean dog.
- Leave a light on when in the residence in the evening.
- Latch all windows and use a window bar where appropriate.
- Use an alarm service and/or a video surveillance package.
